Descriptions and availability of varieties for 2013 on-farm organic trials

Notes:

- 1. Tubers are available as mini-tubers, single-drop tubers or one-cut tubers.
 - a. Mini-tubers are greenhouse-grown tubers from disease-free tissue culture plants. They are smaller than a field-grown tuber, but will produce normal sized tubers. <u>However</u>, minitubers should be planted more shallowly than regular seed pieces. The plants may be smaller initially, and may not compete well with weeds. Minitubers may not be suitable for farmers who use large-scale mechanical weeding operations. They do well under straw.
 - b. Our single-drop tubers were produced on certified organic land, from disease-free minitubers. These tubers are small enough that they need not be cut before planting.
 - c. Our one-cut tubers were produced on certified organic land, from disease-free minitubers. These tubers should be cut into two pieces before planting, and allowed to heal for at least 24 hours (preferably 48 hours).
- 2. Tuber availability is listed as the <u>number of farms we can supply with enough tubers for a plot of 10 plants</u>.
- 3. We have provided all the details that we could quickly gather from our own observations, Seed Savers Exchange yearbooks, or online searches sometimes, that is not much. In many cases, these descriptions are from a single grower in a single year, so they may not be representative. If you have more information for any of these varieties, please share it with us, along with your source (personal observation, other farmers/gardeners, books or online sources). By participating in variety trials you will be helping to make these descriptions more detailed and useful.
- 4. "Check" varieties will be provided along with "trial" varieties, so that we can compare trial varieties between locations.

Mini-tuber check variety: Red La Soda

Single-drop and one-cut check variety: Red Norland

We may purchase certified seed for other varieties such as Satina (yellow), Langlade (white), French Fingerling (red fingerling), and Austrian Crescent (yellow fingerling) as checks for those market classes.
